Leading short term computer rental group Hire Intelligence International Limited (ASX:HII) is pleased to present its cash flow for the quarter ended 31 December 2008.

Receipts from customer for the quarter and half year to 31 December 2008 were \$3,511,000 and \$7,056,000 respectively which were 8.2% and 16.6% higher than the same periods last year.

The large increase in staff costs in the second quarter predominantly relates to the timing of FY2008 profit based bonuses paid to employees. Staff costs for the first half also reflect Busby employees who were not employed during the equivalent period in the prior year.

The increase in other working capital reflects an increase in sub-renting items not in stock, an increase in inventory and expenditure with respect to Busby Web Solutions. Increased profits have resulted in tax payments more than doubling when compared with the first half last year.

Net operating cash flow for the 6 months to 31 December 2007 of \$1,704,000 compares with \$1,661,000 for the same period in the prior year.

HII's attached Appendix 4C for the second quarter ended 31 December 2008 shows cash growing from \$6,251,000 at the end of the prior quarter to \$6,558,000. Cash surplus to normal operational needs stands at \$6.2 million. HII remains debt free and is therefore considering investment opportunities.
